- l. Plot proposed origin-to-destination routes on Boston street map.
- 2. Relate destination descriptions to origin of description, both origin point and personal origin.
- 3. Evaluate the most commonly expressed characteristics of each destination point.
- 4. Compare estimated travel times with actual travel times.
- X 5. Study the proportion of persons familiar with individual destination points, proportion who gave correct proposed route, proportion who estimated traffic time accurately.
- 6. Analyze relative knowledge of destinations: Best known destination points, least known destination points, destination points
 most difficult to reach.
