Design sent October 19th for the aisle window.

Price for aisle window \$100.00 incl. 2 vents and set in place.

Great East window, three great missionaries.

Saint James, Major; Saint Columbo; Saint Anselm. Figures would be ^{seen} seldom. Window featured largely for its warm interior light effect, therefore am planning to treat it somewhat as aisle windows treated, with more prominent ornamental features in warm color.

Clerestory windows: Treat in manner similar to aisle windows but without figures.

Transept windows (two) Treat in full color, with canopies. Cost about \$1400 each.

If price reduced, use more canopy and ornamental features, rather than attempt to save on the figure work itself.

Large window Make sketch more decorative and symbolical.

Make infant to represent a new born babe, rather than two year old child

Saint Joseph should be a young man.

Show Virgin with full face

Make two small groups at the bottom of the "side windows instead of shields

Left hand side "The Massacre of the Innocents" and on right, "The Flight into Egypt."

See letter of January 29th for emblems

Young & Bonawit say size of vents in the nave windows 18 1/2" wide by 18 1/8" in height, full glass size.

Bar should be 9 1/2" from bottom of glass.

Booth transept window ventilator 36" high. First bar 10" from bottom, second bar 26" from bottom.

These sizes were suggested to Young & Bonawit.

*These sizes are full glass sizes
Bars are measured from full glass sizes*

January 31. 1916

ST. Patrick and St. Boniface are too similar.
Avoid this in cartoons.

As one faces the window the left hand lancet shall
be inscribed

"In Memoriam THOMAS and MARY RILEY"

The centre lancet shall be inscribed

"In Memoriam THOMAS and MARY HOGAN"

The right hand lancet shall be inscribed

"In Memoriam JOHN and WINIFRED MCKENNA.
