Are considering having at least one of the nave windows designed for a memorial. Wish to have the great east window given by a worthy family for the same purpose.

C. J. C. gave Mr. George a price of from \$700 to \$1,000 for the nave window in grisaille with figures. And a price of \$3,000 for the east window which should be treated similarly.

C. J. C. is to make designs for these two windows, and an alternative design without the figures for the nave windows. The latter type to cost from \$300 to \$400 each.

Also want a memorial window in the upper window in the north elevation of the Sunday School room.

A Mr. Curtis wants to give this latter window as a memorial to a lady who was prominent in Sunday School work. He has set aside \$1,000 for this window. Subject suggested for this window is, in the centre panel, the figure of Christ holding a child, and in each of the side centre panels, a child facing Him.

^{most to be changed} wrote Mr. Merrick Oct 17, 1917, suggesting a change in the design of the window frame of Sunday School window.

C. J. C. promised Mr. George to make a design for the S. S. window "before very long". C. J. C. expects to hear from Mr. George in relation to his success in arranging for memorial windows. As per letter to Mr. Merrick Oct. 17, 1917.

Dimensions of window as follows:

Lower section $20\frac{1}{2}$ wide x $44\frac{3}{4}$ high.

Upper " $20\frac{1}{2}$ " x $27\frac{1}{2}$ "

These are dimensions of space in which glass rests. The clear opening is $\frac{3}{4}$ " less all around, that is, the clear openings are $19" \times 43\frac{3}{4}"$ and 19×26 respectively.

Later decided to make sash and send it to us.

Dimensions of seals

The glass opening in the upper section is 18" wide by $2\frac{3}{4}$ " high and the lower section is 18" wide by 41" high. These widths really run slightly over 18", about $\frac{1}{16}$ ". The clear opening is $\frac{3}{8}$ " less all around that is the shoulder against which a can will sit is $\frac{3}{8}$ " making the clear opening $\frac{3}{4}$ " narrower and $\frac{3}{4}$ " shorter than the above dimensions...
