

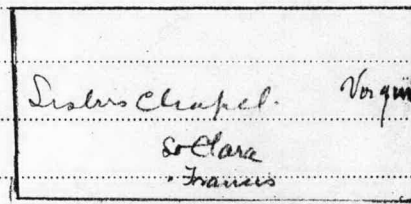

General Information..... The first thing wanted in Saint Paul, Nazareth Hall,  
if a small group of windows in the Convent Chapel.  
There are three small windows on the East, and three small groups  
of two each on the South. Nine windows in all.  
These windows are all to be in simple oblongs in heavy lead with  
a narrow colored border. The centre one in the East is to be enriched  
with a heraldic symbol of the Blessed Virgin (Probably one of la Rose's  
shields with ribbon, etc.)  
The two centre ones on the South are to be enriched with shields  
of St. Clara and St. Francis.  
The glass is to be in tints of white and with enough paint to  
make them sufficiently obscure so that they can't be seen through at  
night. These should be done as soon as possible and sent out to St.  
Paul so that they need not go to the expense of having temporary glass  
put in. (over)
