General Information Church built about 50 years ago - Romanesque. Red brick or stone. Liked the Olivet windows and the aisle windows in the Chapel of the Little Flower. They want rather simple windows.

IMPORTANT: C.J.C. says "We should use a great many slabs in the important windows. The cartoons should be excellently done."

Window to be set in frames provided by the Church.

The stone mullions are to be taken out of the great windows.

The main field of these windows would be in light tints of exquisitely textured glasses, - Antiques and Norman Slabs.
