General Information Cornelius and Silas. Transsept Window.

cross for Christianity symbolizing his conversion. The lamp of faith  
is shown on the shield which is blue.  
St. Silas is a bishop and teacher. The book symbolizes this distinction  
The Shield represents Corinth of which tradition says Silas was Bishop.
