General Information... The iron work is now in place, but can be easily changed. The mullions themselves, Mr. Gilchrist said, could be changed if Mr. Connick so desires, but Mr. Connick likes them as they are.

Subject: The idea is to have them developed along lines related to the most delicate and interesting of the Certosa, with suggestions of subject-matter to be had from Mrs. Taylor. Note should be taken that Millet's "Sower" has already been suggested, but discouraged by the Architect. These windows are both seen from points near the apse in the body of the church. We should be allowed plenty of time for their development along exquisite lines with suggestions of color, pale tints of white and gold. Mr. Gilchrist's idea is that Mr. Connick should have carte blanche in making these windows.
