General Information **Apse Windows like Grace Chapel, San Francisco - Three
Synoptic Gospels - Matthew, Mark and Luke.**

C.J.C. says - "If I think of a good alternate scheme for the apse windows they want that also."
The apse will probably be blanketed by an 80 foot wall in the near future five feet or a little more away.

May 15 - C.J.C. said - "When I saw Mr. Tallmadge in Chicago on my way back, he gave it as his opinion that the apse windows would not be heavily shaded even in the event of a lofty erection on the lot behind them. He said that there had been sufficient space allowed. In any event, I am arranging to treat the windows so that they will function in a brilliant or subdued light."

For addresses of those to be notified as window progresses, see other side.

Note: Mr. Tallmadge wrote Mar. 17 - "The reredos in the chapel will extend above the bottom of the apse windows. The solid wood of the reredos will be about 2 1/2" above the bottom of the window and above that there will be an open wooden grille about 9" or 10" in height... It would be impossible to read the inscriptions on the bottom of the windows from any point in the chapel, and the general effect of the crestring would be to hide the lowest medallion although the color and the light of the glass would be seen through it."
