Three little figures or medallions in each group. "Mr. Connick thinks that the groups could be treated very nicely with emphasis given to the central lancet". Each panel of each window (nine in all) is to have a decoration representing one of the divisions of Literature. The central window to be emphasized.

At the bottom of each panel is to be a condensation gutter which is to be as inconspicuous as possible.

There is just one room to the Library. Three principal windows as shown in sketch, - east, west, and south. Main window south, opposite entrance, will have an inscription across the bottom. The room is 46 x 33 feet. There are four or five other smaller plain leaded windows glazed with half-inch lead. Panes about 5 x 6 1/2 or 7".

The above price must include the cost of setting.
