"About a possible variation in the medallions (shapes) please know that I have made them all alike in outline and in general color scheme, because I felt that in such small windows, enough variation would be obtained in the development of the different themes themselves. I rather like the idea of having these windows uniform, save for such variations, but it is not necessary to do this, and I shall study the possibility of changes, either in contours or colors, or both, as we proceed with the work."
