General Information Eight main auditorium windows. conventional rose design
Windows to be set in frames provided by the Church.
We are to use a great many slabs in the important windows. Also the cartoons
should be excellently done.
The stone mullions are to be taken out of the great windows.
Church built about 50 years ago - Romanesque. Red brick or stone.
They liked the Olivet windows and the aisle windows in the Chapel of
the Little Flower. They want rather simple windows, - probably
rectangular pattern with simple grisaille motif, border, subject-
medallions or symbols, - possibly the eight Beatitudes in the main
window.
When Job is completed, see if we can give Pennell - \$500.00 commission.
For addresses of those to be notified as window progresses, see other side.

The main field of these windows would be in light tints of exquisitely textured glasses, - antiques and Norman slabs.
Border - an ornamental border of foliated design -

The plan is to paint the east windows a little darker than those in the west on account of the morning sun during service. However the difference should not be great.
