All work to have approval of Cram and Ferguson, Architects.

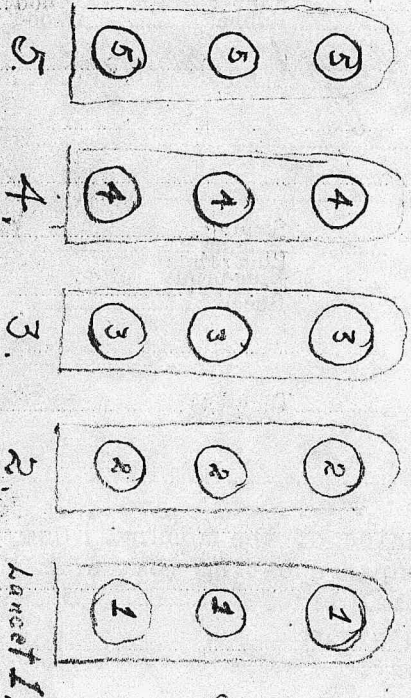
