General Information "Saint Mark". Fifth window from Chancel on South Side
(Nearest Entrance)

The medallion under the figure of Saint Mark is devoted to the Healing of
the Blind Man (Mark 8:22-26).
(Also see notes on sheet #1083.)

Note: Keep in mind Mr. McKee's wish for a rich variety of color.

Mark, a cousin of Saint Barnabas, was probably a Levite who had settled in Cyprus. He was undoubtedly a convert of St. Peter who sympathized more with the Jewish party led by that Apostle than with the Gentile party led by St. Paul. He was something of an independent and free thinker which caused some distressing incidents among the Apostles, especially with Saint Paul. The breach was not healed even by the Council of Jerusalem. However, it was finally patched up and Saint Paul writing from his prison in Rome speaks of him in affectionate terms as a companion and fellow laborer. Mark was a missionary and a martyr and his gospel is especially noted for descriptions of miracles of healing.

Evangelical symbol of Saint Mark represented at his feet - The Lion of Saint Mark. He holds a pen and book of his Gospels.

Medallion, story of the healing of a blind man, related only by Saint Mark in Chapter 8, 22-26. The man was healed in stages, probably because his faith was imperfect. Jesus first strengthened his faith by partially healing him and then, when his faith was adequate, completed the cure.
