February 13,1932 - Mr. Whitehouse wrote: Of course, you realize the position of this window and the altar piece to go under the same, and the only suggestion that I have to make is that you make the window of deep, rich colors, so that any glare of the window will not compete too strongly with the altar piece."
"I believe that this window is going to carry extremely well, because it is in a deep set reveal..and the two windows at the sides of the chancel at the present time have only temporary glass, and it really does not make any difference how much light comes from these windows there will never be a surface reflection on this window."

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
