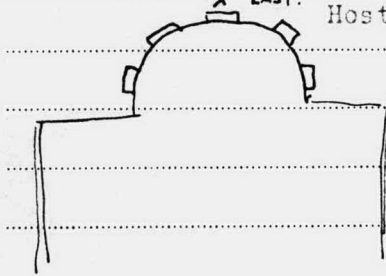

This figure should symbolize the Eucharist. (Figure not too small.)
Host should be held plumb above the Chalice.
The existing windows are green diamond panes
and have been painted over to reduce the
light and the sallow glow cast from them.

Note: Father Meredith prefers figure of Christ
as King of Kings with the Eucharistic symbols.
He also prefers the arms folded toward the center
with the Chalice in one hand and the Host held
above the Chalice with the other hand.
