General Information Window to commemorate the 25th Anniversary of Dr. Kirk's ministry, December 14th, 1926. To be of the eight medallion type, of the Gildersleeve pattern, and is to stand on the east side of the church, making one of two medallion windows, to correspond with the Gildersleeve and Davison windows on the west side. (See other side). This window to be companion to the Davidson Window or "Acts of Mercy" Window which is to be moved from the West side. The subject to be "The Training of the Twelve".
Letter of June 27. from Dr. Kirk's Secretary states that they will pay for the iron work on his window.
Sixth Medallion, "Martyrdom of St. Stephen" to be changed to St. Thomas. Also, Medallion #3. See Dr. Kirk's letter of June 17th.

Some ideas that occur to Dr. Kirk in respect to the incidents are given, herewith.

The window to be read according to the numbering of the medallions, 1, 2, 3, etc.

1. The first contact of the young Galileans with Jesus, who became his friends then, and gathered their brothers into the band of occasional followers. First break of John's disciples to Jesus.

2. This incident shows how Jesus persuaded these men, whom he had formerly made friends, to leave their business as fishermen, and become fishers of men; the call to permanent discipleship.

3. This is the formal ordination of the twelve as apostles.

4. Peter's Confession, and 5 Transfiguration are self-explanatory.

6. Most interesting incident the key to it in the words of Thomas: "Come let us go and die with him."

7, and 8, self-explanatory.
