In the correspondence folder near the beginning, there is a long letter from Professor Friend, describing other clerestory windows in place.
After glass is completely installed, a hometest is to be made in the presence of the Architects or owner.
Article 13 of the contract: Condensation gutters: Furnish and install complete large condensation gutters of 12 oz. lead coated, hard rolled copper, of size approved by the Architects.

Article 14: Existing Glass: The Glass Maker is to remove existing glass and prepare the opening to receive the new glass. All old glass is to become the property of the Owner.
