General Information Three figures shall be included in each of the transept windows:  
those of Saint James, Our Lord, and Saint Peter in the West window; and of the  
Archangel Saint Gabriel, the Blessed Virgin Mary with the Christ Child, and  
the Archangel Saint Michael, in the East window. (Letter of May 24, 1932).

June 10, 1932: "In the east transept window Our Lady with the Holy Child is  
given the central position. Beneath her is her symbol, the Vase of Lilies  
inscribed on a Crowned Shield, while in the side lancets are other symbols  
which are identified with her, - the Gate of Heaven, and the Fountain of the  
Gardens.

St. Gabriel is at her right (symbol, the lily), and St. Michael at her

left, (the Flaming Sword).

Symbols of the Twelve Apostles are represented on shields throughout the two transept windows, - six in each.

Below St. Gabriel is the symbol of St. Bartholomew, (Three Flaying Knives); and St. Simeon (Two Fishes).

Below Our Lady is the symbol of St. Matthew (the Winged Man) and St. Jude, (The Ship); while under St. Michael is St. Matthias (three Dice), and St. James the Less (The Patriarchal Cross surrounded by five stars.)

In the west transept window, Christ, The Light of the World, is represented at the center, with the symbol, Agnus Dei, on the Crowned Shield below.

In the side lancets are the Ark of Noah and the Ship of the Church, symbols of the Old and New Dispensations.

In the upper part of the left lancet, Saint James is represented with Staff and Pilgrim's Hat, with his symbol on the Shield below, (Three Scallop Shells). Opposite is Saint Peter, with the Keys.

In the left lancet, is the symbol of Saint Philip, (The Basket of Bread).

In the center, Saint John, (the Chalice and Serpent), and the Cross of St. Andrew.

At the right is St. Thomas's symbol, (The Carpenter's Square, and Three Spear Heads.)."
