General Information *will undertake to make these windows and install them
complete in new frames and ventilators furnished by the general contractor
for the sum of \$2,500.

April 16 - sent a color sketch and a suggested scheme of symbols for the
entire group of 17 double windows - 15 in the nave and two in the tower.

To carry out the background in light glass in varying tints of white which
would form a pleasant and brilliant support for the enrichment in pure
color through the symbols and borders.

Their main desire is to get plenty of light into the basement. They
now have plain leaded rippled glass in double hung sash.

They will supply sashes and ventilators. Wooden wash.

Suggested scheme of symbols.

Tower Windows. - Symbols of the four great Archangels, Saint Michael, the red cross; Saint Gabriel, the lily; Saint Raphael, the fish; Saint Uriel, and radiant sun.

Nave Windows. -

16 northwest reading from the chancel, the sixteen Canonical Prophets:

Isaias - the tongs and glowing coal.

Jeremias - a star-tipped wand.

Daniel - a ram with four horns.

Ezekiel - a turreted gate.

Osee - a skull

Joel - a trumpet

Amos - a shepherd's crook

Abdias - A pitcher and loaves of bread.

Jonas - a whale

Micheas - a lance and a broken sword.

Nahum - a broken yoke

Habacuc - a temple of the Lord.

Sophonias - a walled city with a sword above it.

Aggeus - a temple being constructed.

Zacharias - an ass.

Malachias - an angel descending from a cloud.

14 southeast - reading from the chancel, the twelve apostles with Saint Paul and Saint John the Baptist.

St.Peter - the keys) typical sketches.

St.Paul - the sword and book) typical sketches.

St. James - the scallop shell

St.John - a serpent issuing from a chalice

St.Andrew - ~~xxxxxxxxxx~~ a saltire cross.

St.Philip - a cross and a basket of loaves.

St.Bartholomew - flaying knives

St.Matthew - a money bag

St.Thomas - a carpenter's square and a spear

St.James of Alpheus - a fuller's bat and stones.

St.Thaddeus - a ship

St.Simon - a fish

St.Matthias - a book and battle axe.

St.John the Baptist - the Lamb of God on a book.
