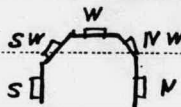

General Information Ten symbols in the three central groups of windows - symbols of Our Lady from the Litany. Type: Trinity Church, Newton Centre. (The symbols to be two in the heads of central window and 2 in heads of each of upper & middle tiers of windows at either side of central one.)

*There is clear protection glass in place now, and the inside groove is empty. Quite a variety of different kinds of protection glass now. One sample measured in the balcony window is 5/16" of an inch thick, fine ribs, up & down. Took templates of all the windows.

(Note, June 23, 1937. Gave Father Riddle price of \$3200 for balcony window according to rough sketch, or \$3300 with medallions in all four of the side lancets and a figure in the middle. He would like to see a further developed sketch of the window with the idea of having Saint Cecilia as a central figure and four musical symbols in the side lancets.)
