General Information "The chances are that all the leads on this job should be painted white - at least on the outside. I want to make a very nice thing of this window. The style is a sort of early Renaissance Georgian. A charming church, surrounded by trees, houses, etc." CJC.
This window above the altar is dedicated to St. Joseph, Protector of the Church, symbolized in the center panel. Symbols of the Old and New Churches - the ark and the Barque of Peter - are in the side medallions, and small symbols of Saint Joseph, the Blessed Virgin, the Church, and the Old and New Dispensations accent the border.
