General Information This design suggests an interesting treatment which may be developed effectively in these eight windows. A luminous pattern of whites, light greens and delicate blues is enriched by accents and designs in pure color. This treatment combines unusual light-giving capacity with an effect of considerable richness in color.

Accompanying the design is a suggestion for further development in design and symbolism. The two small medallions, which may be added later, form part of a scheme dedicated to the Eight Beatitudes, from Christ's Sermon on the Mount. (Matthew V:1-10)

According to this scheme, one of the Beatitudes may be symbolized in each window by a subject from the Life of Christ and by one of the Parables of Our Lord, presented in simple terms of design and color.

The complete scheme is as follows:

1. (See design) "Blessed are the poor in spirit: for their's is the kingdom of heaven."
(L) The Nativity. (R) The Parable of Dives and Lazarus.
2. "Blessed are they that mourn: for they shall be comforted."
(L) Christ Mourning over Jerusalem. (R) The Parable of the Lost Sheep.
3. "Blessed are the Meek: for they shall inherit the earth."
(L) The Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem. (R) The Parable of the Pharisee and the Publican.
4. "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness": for they shall be filled."
(L) Nicodemus Seeks Jesus. (R) The Parable of the Prodigal Son.
5. "Blessed are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy"
(L) The Raising of Lazarus. (R) The Parable of the Unmerciful Servant.
6. "Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God."
(L) Christ Blesses Little Children. (R) The Parable of the Wise and Foolish Virgins.
7. "Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God."
(L) Christ Rebukes Peter for Injuring Malchus. (R). The Parable of the Good Samaritan.
