Description of design sent in letter: "East clerestory window, devoted to three noble women of the Old Testament - Esther, Ruth, and Rebecca. ...I have represented Esther the Queen, in royal robes, holding a branch of flowering olives to symbolize the peace she secured for the Hebrews under Ahasuerus. Ruth bears the sheaf of grain and other gleanings are designed at her feet. Rebecca holds a pitcher, recalling her selection as the wife of Isaac.
