General Information "I should like to keep the border fairly wide, though simple. I feel that the window is a little wide for its height and a wide border would correct that condition. I think we should include St. John's traditional and identifying symbols in some way. They are quite universally recognized and add interest and clarity to his magnificent and gentle character. Use a simple figure of St. John (similar to Pittsfield), but omit floral decorations. (Col. Wilson especially liked the Laconia and Pittsfield windows ((see photographs)). Col. Wilson said that his limit in price is \$350, but if a figure can be had at a not too great extra, he would prefer it to a geometrical design. Include verse from Gospel of St. John "He that believeth in ME shall have everlasting life.".
Likes narrow leads.

The windows are in memory of Col. Wilson's father and mother - simple quiet people.
