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our original plan, being dominated be symbols of the Creation, the Fall, and the Deluge, and setting forth the angel of the Lord over each one.

At either side of the Creation - the animals above and the fish below - are the red-winged Seraphim and the blue-winged Cherubim.

The Angel of Justice with flaming sword rules the central panel, while the figures of Adam digging and Eve spinning occupy the spaces at either side.

The figures flanking the Ark represent Noah building the Ark and the return of the dove after the flood.

According to plan, the third window devoted to Egyptian bondage represents Joseph in Egypt, ruler of the land under Pharoah, building graneries in

preparation for the famine. In the side panels he is sold into Egypt end welcomes his family.

The young prince, Moses, dominates the central panel, with his rescue from the bulrushes symbolized below. His sojourn by the well in Midian and the miracle of the Burning Bush are suggested in the side borders.

The Deliverance under Moses is the theme of the last panel, with the crossing of the Red Sea and the destruction of the Egyptiens indicated below the dominant figure. The plagues are symbolized by ten arrows at one side and the Passover is symbolized at the other.

The canopy is used as an interesting border in brilliant white glasses with enough patterning to keep its brilliance in place. The vertical movement is accented and the subjects are kept in simple, telling silhouette.

I shall be easer to have your reaction to these designs when you have had an opportunity to share them with ar. Walker and others interested. The remainder of the designs can be developed in the order that you think best. I am looking forward with pleasant anticipation to the prospect of carrying them out in the color and light of actual glass.
