The general plan of this design is conceived in harmony with the chancel windows, but developed for a larger, comprehensive treatment related to the school established there.

The great areas are made articulate in somewhat lighter background bues accounted by brilliantly colored medallions, symbolising the Reavenly Choir, designed to bland unobtrusively into the structure of the pattern.
