General Information The library is paneled in oak. See rough sketch sent by Architect showing roughly what he has in mind.
"The windows, as we see it, should contain a very rich medallion, the rest of the window remaining very simple, maybe, with a few faint symbols, glass to be used should all be clear glass with a sprinkling of antique."
Subjects for the other windows to be "Christ Blessing the Little Children", "Immaculate Conception", "St. Don Basco" and other Saints pertaining to boys and children."
Father Flanagan is the founder of Boystown and the boy theory should be carried through as much as possible on all the windows.

Medallions on background of ~~chance~~ or diamonds. C.J.C. wrote: "I have in mind for use in that background a glass that has proved very successful in attaining just the effect that I think you have in mind. It is a glass known as Colonial Antique, and I am sending you some characteristic samples. You will observe that it may be used with actual clear glass in a more satisfying manner than can the familiar antique glass, as it is gentler both in tint and in texture.
