General Information Enriched in a manner comparable to the chancel windows.

These lancets are suggested in even lighter tones than the designs for the Sacristy vestibule windows, for I feel that we should make the most of the available window space to insure an abundance of light throughout the nave. (When we come to the principal aisle windows, I think we might strike an even lighter note, accented, of course, with pure rich color in rather restricted areas. With this plan in mind, we shall be able to develop a coherent, related theme of design throughout the windows, and, at the same time, avoid monotonous repetition, - giving each group an individual character of its own, while uniting all the windows in a unison of color and design."
