This window is in full view from the sanctuary and Father Meredith would like something nice, but not too expensive. Not necessary for it to be a figure window.

Dec. 1, 1938, we wrote Mr. Collins: "I think we may find a motif for our design in the name of the Church - the Blessed Sacrament."

The window offers a delightful opportunity for a simple but brilliant color composition, and I think it can be beautifully treated without an introduction of figures for \$200.

Description written in letter: "...I have taken the wheat and the grape as my motif for the decorative pattern, thus symbolizing the Sacrament, with the Sacred Monogram at the centre. The design offers an excellent opportunity for pure and rich color, but - at the same time - brilliant color arrangement, and I am confident that it will function perfectly in its position in the Church."
