General Information Simple pattern. Something like design for side chancel window
in St. Mark's Church, Minneapolis.

The purpose of the windows is to soften the light back of the pulpit which
is now reflected in the faces of the congregation by white ground glass.
The predominating color in the rest of the windows is green - not of very
expensive type, and a lot of milk glass is used. Mrs. Swett "does not think she
would care for green as it is too harsh and cold a light. Leaves color to Mr. Connick's
judgment."
A strong light comes through the windows and disturbs the congregation
during service.

Perhaps the frames can be sent down and filled here to avoid a trip for
setting.

When sending the sketch we wrote: "The colorful foliated grisaille field is enriched with symbols - flowers in the lower one and a ruby-winged Seraphim above. I have kept the color scheme in cool blues with contrasting notes of gold and ruby, and just a suggestion of green. The color and texture is strong enough to effectively control the glare of light, and as I visualize the composition in actual glass, I know that the windows will constitute a very lovely enrichment to your church."
