General Information See photograph of interior filed in correspondence file. Mr. Crowe wrote May 15, "The writer's and Sisters' ideals are to keep the windows very simple in design, and would like a predominance of dark amber shades - if you think this a good idea."

For the four lancets of the choir group, east and west, are suggested symbols of the four Doctors of the Church, ~~Saint Ambrose, Saint Gregory, Saint Augustine and Saint Jerome.~~ In the color sketch are represented the crowned symbols of ~~Saint Ambrose, the Beehive and Scourges, and Saint Gregory, the Flaming Heart and Arrows.~~

The little pair of windows in the north wall of the transept bear traditional symbols of the Old and the New Testament, the Ark of Noah and the Barque of Saint Peter.

For the narthex windows we have suggested in little medallions kneeling angels
