General Information This group includes the fig figure of Shakespeare and the small figures of Grotius and Copernicus

The remaining window of the Renaissance is to be devoted to Grotius, Shakespeare and Copernicus. Hugo Grotius, Dutch publicist and statesman, the genius who at fifteen edited the encyclopaedic work of Martianus Capella, would be represented in the first medallion. A master of history, theology, jurisprudence, politics, classics and poetry, he was animated by an ardent desire for peace and concord, and believed in a code of common Christianity irrespective of sect. He would be represented writing his great De jure belli et pacis - a work which brought him no profit but a reputation more widely spread and enduring than any other legal treatise has ever enjoyed. In the balancing medallion would be represented Nicolaus Copernicus, Polish astronomer and founder of an entirely new system of astronomy which

fundamentally changed man's outlook on the universe. He was also deeply interested in currency reform, and his medical skill was always at the service of rich and poor alike. The central figure would represent William Shakespeare, English poet, player and playwright - the greatest of all dramatists.
