General Information A pleasant counterchange of color has been introduced in
the medallion backgrounds and borders, adding considerable interest to the
scheme without disturbing a pleasing balance of color throughout. You will
find subtle variations from the Conover design, and these would be continued
in the last two windows, adding to their interest.

Dr. Bliss was a famous missionary leader. See book "That they may have life"
which gives a good conception of Dr. Bliss' work in connection with the
American University of Beirut. Was pastor of the church also
Dr. Stocking was referred to by the president of Wheaton College as "a
perfect gentle knight"

This window is designed in color and light to celebrate the noble qualities of the great Christian leader, Saint Paul and his devoted follower, Saint Timothy, and to suggest similar qualities and virtues in the lives of their followers in modern times.

Saint Paul is represented in the second panel, bearing the pen and the book of his epistles. On the open book below is the text from II Timothy 2:3, "Thou therefore endure hardness as a good soldier of Jesus Christ."

The upper medallion of the first panel is related to Saint Paul and symbolizes him on shipboard in the midst of the storms of his missionary voyages (Acts 27). The medallion below is devoted to the modern missionary spirit of Dr. Bliss and his direction of the work at Beirut. He stands before the students of various races in an attitude of teaching.

Balancing the figure of Saint Paul is his devoted follower, Saint Timothy, with his symbols, the lighted lamp and the letter from Saint Paul, emphasizing their devoted friendship.

The open book below bears the inscription, "A good minister of Jesus Christ, nourished up in the words of faith," from I Timothy 4:6. The related medallion in the fifth panel represents Saint Timothy's baptism of converts, and below, the symbol of the Good Shepherd, suggesting the pastoral or shepherding qualities of Dr. Stocking.

The medallions of the central panel stand for the work of the church, symbolized by teaching in the upper medallion and prayer in the lower.

Across the base is the inscription:

"In memory of Howard ^{S.} Bliss, Pastor 1894-1902 - Jay T. Stocking, Pastor 1915-1927"
