Window in the Sanctuary of Compassion, Alcove #236, Forest Lawn Memorial - Rark, Slandele, California.

Note: Have delicate painting on these.

This window is designed as a brilli nt symbol of the great Christian quality - Compassion.

The dominant figures represent characters whose lives were outstanding examples of Compassionate devotion.

Saint Tabitha - also called Doreas - the disciple "full of good works and alsodeeds which she did" (Acts 9:36), and Saint Stephen - deacon and protocartyr - chosen to take care of the widows and orphans - "And Stephen," full of faith and power did great wonders and miracles among the people". (Acts 6:8.)

Saint Tabitha holds the basket of loaves - to feed the hungry, while Saint Stephen bears his traditional symbol - the stones of his martyrdom.

Through the six medallions below are symbolized the Acts of Mercy taught us by Christ - and recorded by Smint Matthew in the thirty-fifth and
thirty-sixth verses of his twenty-fifth chapter. These admonitions are:
to Clothe the Maked, Give Drink to the Thirsty, Feed the Mungry,
Visit the Imprisoned - and the Sick, and to Marbor the Sarborless.

The fields of these medallions are of ruby - the traditional color symbol of Divine Passion. Medallions and figures are all voven into a leaded dismand pattern of warm tints, enriched with foliated forms and notes of pure rich color.
