The Champlin Memorial Window
upper portion of the third from the pulpit in the
southeast elevation
State Street Congregational Church
Portland

This window is devoted to the Apostles Andrew and James.

Saint Andrew bears his traditional diagonal Cross, while Saint

James bears the pilgrim's staff and gourd, - his characteristic

hat inscribed with the shell.

Both are robed in blue and white, traditional color symbols of heavenly contemplation and purity.

Above them are patterned flames of divine seal, while the tracery member is enriched with an angel of Praise.

A growing foliated pattern in character with that in the lower panels, enriches the field and outlines the smaller medallions, bearing symbols of the lily of purity. The blue borders are accented with stars of heavenly faith and steadfastness.

While the color design suggests a complete harmony with the panels below, it is our thought to select and develop the actual glass in a manner to admit an abundance of illumination without sacrificing the glowing color, the quality of which is
