General Information Last window on north side, "Blessed are they which are  
persecuted for righteousness' sake: for their's is the kingdom of  
heaven." Principal medallions - "Saint John the Baptist in Prison"  
(S.Mark 6:17-29), and "St.Peter in Prison." (Acts 12:4-9)  
Last window on south side, "Blessed are the peacemakers; for they  
shall be called the Children of God". Principal medallions, "CHRIST  
Stilling the Tempest" (St.Luke 8:22-25), and "The Conversion of St.Paul"  
(Acts 9:1-10).  
In each window below the principal medallions would be related medallions  
with significant subjects or symbols. (as in the windows already in place.

For addresses of those to be notified as window progresses, see other side.

Feb.19,1948 - The one on the south symbolizes Blessed are the Peacemakers; for they shall be called the Children of God. The dominant medallions are devoted to Christ stilling the Tempest (St.Luke 8:22-25), and the Conversion of Saint Paul (Acts 9:1-10).

The opposite window suggests Blessed are they which are persecuted for Righteousness' sake; for their's is the kingdom of Heaven, with the medallions devoted to St.John the Baptist in prison (St.Mark 6:17-29) and Saint Peter in prison (Acts 12:4-9).

The fields are designed in harmony with the other windows.
