General Information Philip and Bartholomew.

The Upper portion of the window is devoted to the Apostles, Philip and Bartholomew. Philip holds his usual symbol, - the cross; and Bartholomew, - the flaying knife.

Window devoted to Christ and the Rich Young Ruler. The yellow of the Young Ruler's outer garment would not go well against the ruby of the field, but we have introduced this color in the undergarment. Below is the symbol of the camel and the needle related to the central theme. We have introduced an abundance of white throughout the field and the medallion, at the same time harmonizing this window with the others." NOTE: Introduce symbol of the Money Bag or Wallet in middle medallion.
