General Information #6 - Second last window from chancel on south side, symbolizes Saint Martin Welcomed to Tours ("his affectionate welcome and rejoicing upon his return to Tours").

#7 - Window farthest from chancel on south side, symbolizes Saint Martin's Destruction of the heathen temples.

The windows should not be too light and should have a fairly good painted texture.
