General Information..... decorative tree growing from a fountain much like the
chancel window in St. Rose of Lima, Sacramento, - to
accent the two central panels. She liked that window
very much. She would like an oak pattern. The rest
of the window is to be in light grisaille, in the nature of the lower part
of the present chancel window.
She likes mild colors - browns and purple. Doesn't like a predominance of
blue.
(She is going up there to see a carpenter about the possibility of removing
the four heavy horizontal members in the panels.) also about taking out
the smaller muntins.
Sent photo of cartoon, together with color sketch for approval of Vestry.
Mrs. Gardiner wants to be sure we follow color suggested in sketch, and not
that shown in the cartoons.
