This first window is given as a thanksgiving for life of a soldier who came through three years of combat without a scratch.  
We sent photographs of the St. Louis sketch, Chestnut Hill, Biddeford and Albany as suggestions.

Aisle window devoted to the gentle warriors, Saint Martin of Tours and St. George. Following tradition, St. Martin is represented on horseback, as he divides his cloak with the beggar....(the sequel of that charming legend ...St. Martin lay on his bed that night - he had a vision of Our Lord enthroned wearing the severa<sup>d</sup> half of his cloak. The Golden Legend of Jacobus de Voragine records it - "Martin, yet new in faith, hath covered me with this vesture."

The young St. George is represented in armor with banner inscribed with the Cross, and spear piercing the dragon of evil. Open books below each figure are inscribed with significant texts. Under St. Martin, "Let us therefore follow after the things which make for peace," (Romans 14:19) - and under St. George, "Take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day." (Ephesians 6:13).

Growing foliated vine forms enrich the wide borders, flowering in the red rose of Divine Love. A pattern of oak leaves and acorns might equally well be represented here to suggest vigorous strength in the faith.
