(When we come to make other designs for further windows, be sure to label the Jameses Minor and Major, instead of Less and Greater.

(Mr. MacNeil will approve the design himself.)

The clerestory theme is now changed - they are to be devoted to the history of the Church, starting on the south side nearest the chancel, with Peter and Paul; then Augustine and Francis, Wycliffe and Luther. This last would be the one that would replace Saint James Minor and Saint Jude in the old plan. Work over this sketch, and just put in the figures.

On the north side, continuing back toward the chancel, would be the pilgrims represented by Eider Brewster; then Elliot. The next window, Edwards and William Carey or Adironam Judson; and in the last, Mary Lyons and their own

pastor and preacher Emerich, who was the grandfather of Bishop Emerich of  
Detroit. This subject-plan is not final, but still open to consideration.
