We suggested: "...the booklet of Our Lady of Our Lady of the ~~Wayside~~ (Highway), suggests some fine themes for the enrichment of the windows, and it seems to us that a rather simple plan making use of the present sash and perhaps even some of the present glass, inserting new panes enriched with designs symbolizing Our Lady's Seven Journeys, her sacred symbols of the lily and rose monograms; and perhaps emblems from her Litany, such as the Mirror of Justice, House of Gold, Tower of David, Enclosed Garden, etc., would be most significant and appropriate.
The little medal could be represented over the entrance, and perhaps in several other places.

The chapel is set back a considerable distance from the main highway, Route 28, and from a side street to the east, and ~~so there is no reason why some of the present clear glass should remain.~~

We have suggested the first of Our Lady's journeys, to her cousin Elizabeth, - the Visitation, as the dominant theme. Below are secondary symbols of Our Lady, - the vase of lilies for purity, and a representation of the medal of Our Lady of the Wayside.

This plan would involve changing only six panes in each window, but the color and significant symbolism would do wonders for that little chapel. We would have different themes in each window, including the seven journeys of Our Lady and many symbols from her Litany.

Note: We are to change all the clear glass now in the panes, to opaque glass where colored figured glass is not inserted.
