As suggested, the red rose and the sheaf of  
wheat are used as the principal motifs, - the  
flowering red rose pattern enriching the field,  
and appearing with the sheaf of wheat in the  
dominant medallion.

The wheat motif occurs again through the  
border, ~~with the letters of the Sorority.~~

At the base is the inscription requested.

The palette is a brilliant but colorful one,  
with deep, rich tones of ruby, blue and green,  
contrasted with lighter passages admitting an  
abundance of illumination, while creating a full  
color effect. The glass would be well textured  
in the light of its western exposure.

Note: Remove all the small Greek Letters - in the  
border and on the sheaf of wheat. Also enlarge  
the inscription.
