An abundance of fine, cure blue is suggested, well contrasted by ruby, with touches of green, gold and silver.

The sketch is intended as an impression of color and light in action, and all the exquisite detail of line and form will be developed in the full sized drawings and actual glass, as you have seen it in other wincows of ours.

Note: Mrs. Rich would like a different position of the mother's head and shoulders — to add to the impression of the upward movement. She feels that the present arrangement in the design makes the figure seem crouched or crowded in height.
