We have now completed the rough color sketches for the last three windows, to complete the northeast clerestory, and are sending them to you herewith.

Starting with the window nearest those already in place, and reading from right to left, away from the chancel, the first is devoted to Saint Eunice instructing her son, Saint Timothy; and Saint Helena, crowned as queen, and bearing her traditional symbol of the cross, holding the young Saint Constantine, who also bears the crown to suggest his future glory.

The next group is devoted to Saint Monica and Saint Jane Aya, - Monica with her illustrious son, Saint Augustine; and Saint Jane Aya with her equally famous offspring, Saint Dominic.

The last group represents Saint Sophia with her three daughters, Faith, Hope and Charity; and Saint Felicitas surrounded by symbolical representations of her seven sons who suffered martyrdom.

The alternating color scheme has been maintained with various shades, adding interest to the entire group.
