IMPORTANT: For all clerestory windows, add 1/4" on the bottom to the present size, so that the name plate is a little higher. (Message from the setter, Mr. Wrska, Apr. 1952.).

Saint Paul is represented with the open book and sword of the Spirit, which is also the Sword of Martyrice. The book might be inscribed with the text "I have fought the good fight" although it may be difficult to distinguish from the floor. At one side is his traditional symbol, the three fountains, and at the other, the adder coming from the fire, recalling the miracle at Medita after the ship-wreck on the way to Rome.

IMPORTANT NOTE: This Saint Paul window, and the Matthew window is to be sure to harmonize with the Saint John window, which is in place. That is, with the blue fields.

When this window is finished, we are to send the sketch to Miss Jeffords to present to Bishop Bowen. 2/2/53.

Jan.21,1953. O.E.S. reports: Our clerestory windows are very good. Luke is a little darker than the others. We should keep down the blues.
