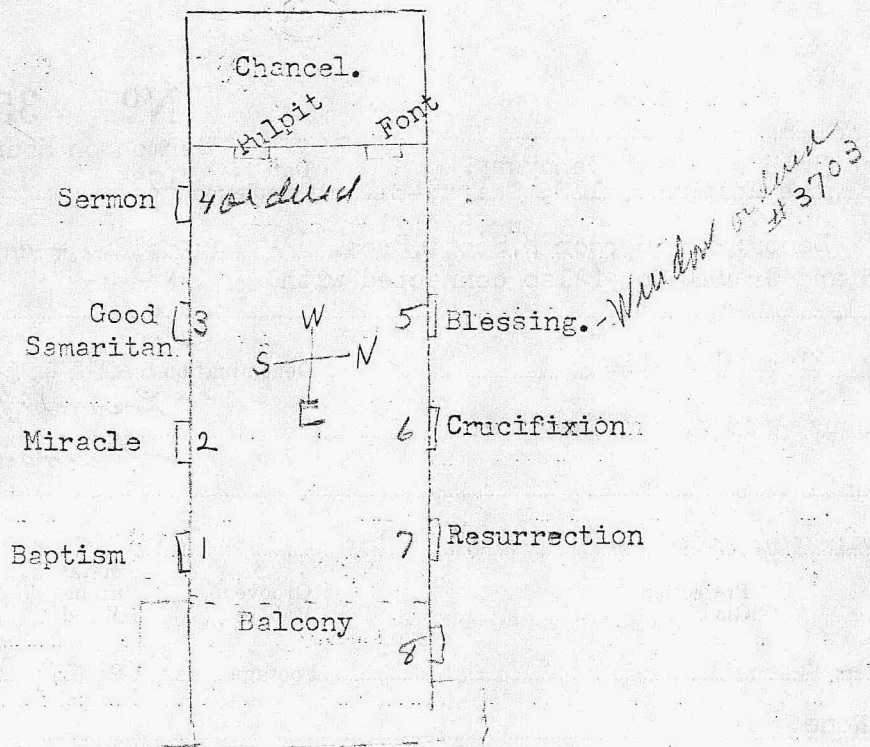

General Information The four windows on the south side - Life of Our Lord:  
1. Baptism. 2. Miracle; 3. Good Samaritan; 4 (window nearest the pulpit)  
Sermon on the Mount.

(On the north side, beginning in the opposite direction with the window nearest the Font: 1. Christ Blessing Little Children, 2. The Crucifixion, 3. The Resurrection.  
The 8th window, or the one nearest the main entrance to the nave is partially covered by the balcony. Only about 2/7 of the window is visible below the balcony and about the same space including the stone tracery above the balcony. This will have to have a special treatment, so keep this in mind as we develop the typical design for the group, so that the parts which do show will be in harmony with the others.

Develop typical design, Sermon on the Mount.

NOTE: Mr. Nyson gave us this note about the tracery there - to take off 1/4" all the way around all tracery shapes, to set them; - or plan to cut them in two or three pieces.

As planned, it is devoted to the Sermon on the Mount, represented in the dominant medallion.

Our Lord stands in the attitude of teaching, above the multitude of listeners.

On the open book below is inscribed the first of the Beatitudes, - Our Lord's teaching of the way of true Christian life.

The light silvery field is enriched with growing vine forms, suggesting Christ's words, "I am the Vine, ye are the branches".

It is our thought to alternate the color arrangement with ruby as the color of the medallion fields and border in every other window.
