Do not use angels. They have all the angels they need now. The present
chancel window is devoted to Christ Blessing Children - St. Luke is
represented in the transept, and an angel at the rear. At one side, at the
back, is an allegorical figure of Hope.

Simple treatment - kept light and simple, with colorful accents - symbol,
the Lamp of Faith, with background to harmonize with the other windows.

For addresses of those to be notified as window progresses, see other side.

Then, the design for the transept window introduces even a more brilliant character, with abundant use of light tones, again enriched with foliated pattern, supporting the central symbol of the lamp of faith. We are including a space for a possible memorial inscription here.
