General Information The Nativity in the right-hand window, and Moses in the Bullrushes on the left-hand side.

They like the shape of the medallion in the Springboro window and the patterned border around the edge of that window. They like the type of the Nativity medallion in the First Universalist Church, Manchester, photograph, but they want rather bright coloring. They want the inscription to be in black on the light background.

Field to be in simple light tinted glass, as in Springboro, or possibly with some light patterning.

There are 3 feet between the two panels.

The chapel is for children 3, 4, and 5 year olds. The Thompson's little son was 4 years old when he died.

For addresses of those to be notified as window progresses, see other side.

"At the left, Pharaoh's daughter finds the baby Moses in his ark among the flags at the river's brink. Two of the accompanying maids and the sister who watched are suggested above.

"This composition is balanced by the Nativity scene, with Mary and Joseph watching over the Christ Child."
