General Information Make alternative studies for a typical nave window, with a simple field and medallion, and also a more elaborate theme.

Mr. Whitehouse wrote: "Relative to the Nave windows, I am wondering if something like this for economy could be worked out - (The idea we are using for the side sanctuary windows - a small medallion at the top, with the rest of the glass some type of antique that will allow quite a little light to come through).

The other scheme to have a theme throughout.
They are undecided whether to try and go through with a program of the conventional stained glass or not.

For addresses of those to be notified as window progresses, see other side.

For the four main nave windows, we have side two
Sug. Lions:

A. With a simple leaded pattern, but a little more
color in borders and spots, and a dominant symbol, I think
the windows might be attempted at about four hundred dollars
each.

If we went into painted textures here to somewhat
control the direct light, the cost would be increased to
five hundred dollars each.

We could use related symbols such as those
of the four evangelists on one side, and the Four
Major Prophets on the other. We have indicated
here the Winged Lion of Saint Mark.

These windows might be pretty brilliant and
the light would certainly be pretty strong. To
remedy this, another plan is suggested in Sketch B,
with a design of foliated grisaille all through
the fields and borders, and dominant medallions
that could well be devoted to significant incidents
in the life of Our Lord. In this case we have
suggested the Nativity. This plan works out very
much like our windows in your First Presbyterian
Church at Moscow. I am sending a Kodachrome and a
black and white of two of these. A cost of about
eight hundred dollars each is indicated.

These costs do not include installation. Setting
costs vary so much with differing circumstances, that
it would be pretty risky to include it at these
prices. If it is possible to take advantage of
available scaffolding, the cost would be considerably
reduced. Fortunately we have some good friends in
Seattle who are stained glass craftsmen, who would
make the installations at reasonable costs.

Make a typical design of a nave window, showing how we would use the Tudor
Glass #9 - the cool gray in the field; with Tudor Glass #12, amber, in the
borders and just a few accenting spots through the field. It will not do
to combine them in an irregular off-hand pattern, but the #12 might be used in
a few planned and balanced accents. This plan to be used for the 7 nave and
the 2 side-sanctuary windows. Gave price of \$1,950 for the entire group, giving
him the benefit of any saving. This based on a figure of \$230 for each nave
and \$170 for each of the 2 sanctuary windows. If we should install, the
cost of installation would be about \$160 for the installation of the 7 nave
and 2 sanctuary; and \$140 for scaffolding, making a total of \$300.

This is about \$7.00 per foot.

Note: "They wondered if they could have a little
more amber in the windows. They have a good many
dull days there, and the amber would have a
tendency to warm up the windows somewhat." Keep
this in mind, and emphasize the amber somewhat if
possible.
